**Regulations on Financial Aid to Registered  
Private Schools for White Pupils**

Government Notice 60 of 1964

(OG 2546)

came into force on 15 December 1963

The Regulations relating to Financial Aid to Registered Private Schools for White Pupils were originally made in terms of section 117 of the Education Ordinance 27 of 1962, which was repealed by section 83 of the Education Act 16 of 2001. Pursuant to section 81(5) of the Education Act 16 of 2001, the Regulations relating to Financial Aid to Registered Private Schools for White Pupils are deemed to have been made under that Act.

**ARRANGEMENT OF REGULATIONS**

1. Subject to the proviso to subsection (5) of section *one hundred and fourteen* of the ordinance, financial aid to a private school may be approved provided that at the time of any

application for financial aid at least fifteen pupils of compulsory school-going age are enrolled in the register of such school.

2. (1) The amount according to which the financial aid is calculated, shall be fifty rand per pupil per year in respect of enrolled pupils in standards up to and including the eighth, who on the first day of January of any year are at least six years old and shall include [illegible] pupils not older than sixteen years: Provided that a pupil who becomes sixteen years old in the course of a school year may be taken into account for financial aid for that school year.

(2) The amount mentioned in subregulation (1) shall be doubled in respect of pupils in standards six up to and including eight in schools offering instruction through the medium of the home language, for which appropriate schools controlled by the Department do not provide and in such cases there shall be no age limit.

(3) Unless a pupil has been enrolled for a full school quarter and has been present for at least seventy-five percent of the school days during such quarter, he shall not be taken into account in the calculation of the financial aid: Provided however, that in the case of epidemic diseases and under other abnormal conditions the Director shall decide whether or not financial aid shall be rendered in respect of such period.

3. The Administrator may determine the maximum number of pupils, either per school as a whole or for a division thereof, to be taken into account for the purpose of calculating financial aid.

4. If the number of pupils required for the rendering of financial aid under regulation *three* is smaller than fifteen for any two consecutive school quarters, no financial aid shall be rendered in respect of the second such school quarter: Provided that financial aid may be re-instituted after the number of children required for the rendering of such aid has been maintained for at least one school quarter.

5. Subject to the provisions of regulation *four* the financial aid shall be rendered quarterly according to the enrolment and attendance of pupils during the previous school quarter.

6. The financial aid shall be used exclusively for the remuneration of teachers and for the equipment of the school.

7. Financial aid shall be rendered as long as -

- (i) the Department is satisfied that the school fulfils the reasonable needs of the population or a group of the population;
- (ii) the attendance is regular;
- (iii) the progress of the pupils is satisfactory; and
- (iv) its management is conducted in an efficient and satisfactory manner.

8. Any school receiving financial aid in terms of the regulations shall -

- (a) keep an enrolment register and a register of daily attendance by pupils in the form required by the Department from time to time;
- (b) obtain the approval of the Department for the appointment of every teacher it intends employing at such school;
- (c) furnish to the Department the returns required by it from time to time.

**9.** Financial aid may be approved to an institution, body or organisation the purposes of which is the instruction of, deviate pupils in hospitals or institutions adapted for the treatment of such deviate pupils. Notwithstanding the provisions of the foregoing regulations the Administrator shall determine the amount per pupil per year and shall impose the conditions governing the rendering of such financial aid.

**Interpretation of the regulations**

**10.** If there should be any doubt as to the interpretation of the provisions of these regulations the Director shall decide thereon and such decision shall be final.

**Deviations in time of war or national emergency**

**11.** If a state of war or national emergency arises the Administrator may approve a deviation from the provisions of these regulations.

**Commencement of regulations**

**12.** These regulations shall come into force on the 15th December, 1963.
