Additional Appropriation Act 14 of 2001

(GG 2671)

came into force on date of publication: 24 December 2001

ACT

To appropriate supplementary amounts of money to meet additional financial requirements of the State during the financial year ending 31 March 2002.

(Signed by the President on 11 December 2001)

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of the Republic of Namibia, as follows:

Appropriation of amounts of money for financial requirements of the State

1. Subject to the State Finance Act, 1991 (Act No. 31 of 1991), the amounts of money shown in the Schedule are appropriated as a charge to the State Revenue Fund for additional financial requirements of the State during the financial year ending 31 March 2002.

Short title

2. This Act is called the Additional Appropriation Act, 2001.
