AMENDMENT OF SEA FISHERIES REGULATIONS

The Minister of Fisheries and Marine Resources has under section 32 of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1992 (Act 29 of 1992), made the regulations set out in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

1. In this Schedule "the Regulations" means the Sea Fisheries Regulations, promulgated by Government Notice 1 of 1993, as amended by Government Notices Nos. 2 of 10 January 1994, 204 of 1 November 1994, 88 of 1 June 1995, 153 of 15 September 1995, 26 of 1 February 1996, and 14 of 15 February 1997.
2. The Regulations are hereby amended by the substitution of the following annexure for Annexure Q:
